7. **General Business:**

Scott Macindoe addressed the meeting.

Here to give respect to Kaikoura Club – thanks for help on the Kahawai Legal challenge – in top 1% of contributors. Gave a brief history of the KLC. Scott thanked group for sending Ted to Hokianga Accord. Nga Puhi 200,000 people, Ngai Tahu 35,000 others about 30,000. Sonny Tau has said that 99% of the time Nga Puhi go fishing it is under the amateur regulations. Scott read letter from Accord.

Discussion of Kahawai IPP, history and process. Scott stressed the need to get the documents scanned and on the web.

Discussion of Te Korowai process. Scott recommended putting something in Fishing News – 300 words when we have something ready to go public.

Very impressed with green groups – Greenpeace – Tuna, Forest & bird, ECO Toothfish. See “The Last Ocean” – environmental strip mining.

NZ Sport Fishing Council – has released an ambitious plan. Going for SPARC funding.

Budget \$100K this year.

Not interested in forming a recreational fishing body that does not include Maori.

Vision 2030 Key performance indicators submission due next week.

Fishing is part of what it is to live in this wonderful country.

Scott discussed the assertion that rec fishing advocates are poles apart – we stand together when required – gave many examples.

Scott expressed concern at lack of consultation with major groups and on issue of funding.

Sees them as a mechanism for dividing and breaking intellectual horsepower of rec fishing.

Capture records of the oldest people in the district about their fishing stories – anecdotal information of history.

Scott thanked the group.

IPP on Hapuku – send email to Trish Rae about inclusion on Setting. Estimate of catch – T 20, J 30, R 300, Ray 30, J 0, W 0, Br 20, Bi 20.

Richard – feeling of HAP catch in Kaikoura over the last 20 years. The last little hot spots are getting depleted. Depleted and declining – size is well down. Bill - look at my photos, average size for the schoolies was 10 – 12 lb, now down to 2 or 3 lb.

MFish use time as a weapon. Why weren't we told earlier?
