

Paua to 6 per person.

Keep size at 125 for recreational fishing.

Keep recreational amount held in freezer to 24 paua per person.

Not happy with the 150 limit for crays, and support the Telson clipping and 18 bag limit.

Blue cod. All agreed with the 330 size increase. Lots of discussion around the 10 blue cod, and there are acknowledged that there are issues, and there was a majority to retain the 10 blue cod.

Perch – most agreed with 20, but Bill want to keep it at 30.

Want to investigate a size limit for perch but need more data on which to base it.

Discussion of having two corridors for access through the taiapure – to ensure that the ramp access is always available in the future. Or some other mechanism to guarantee long term access.

Stop the large scale harvesting of live bladder kelp in the Kaikoura region. Small amounts can be taken for paua food.

No commercial harvesting of beach cast seaweed.

Suggest keeping trawlers outside of 3 miles from the coast.

Hook sizes to be recommendations only, and not a strict rule. Smaller hooks are required to catch Tarakihi and other species.

Suggestion for no potting between 15th August to 15th October, to protect females in berry.

Suggestion that all pots have a trap door, so that they can be emptied into a bin – to reduce the rate of damage. Good practice.

Discussion of the difficulty of capping the number of charter boats in Kaikoura.

Need blue cod on the charter boat catch reporting forms.

Moved – that this be reformatted as a submission and be put in to Te Korowai on behalf of the recreational fishers.

Moved – Neil Seconded Grant Stringer – Agreed – unanimous.
